We will be back in touch in early March with specific timings and information – Save the date!














# World Book Day — Thursday 3rd March

## Maths challenge success

Two of our sixth form mathematics students, George Lait and Furkan Cam, have achieved the top grade in the Senior Maths Challenge achieving a Gold award in the November entry. The Challenge is organised by the University of Leeds Maths department and is an international competition focussing on interesting and challenging questions and problems aimed at the top performers in Maths in the country. There are 25 multi-choice questions and out of the entrants approximately 10 % achieve gold.

They both went on to the next round (called the Kangaroo) in which they were around 6000 students taking part. At this stage, they both achieved a very creditable Merit.

They are the Maths stars for the future.

Daniel is already a member of our Year 9 Student Council and Whole School Student Council, so he has practical experience of identifying and working on student concerns and engaging in school wide issues. He also has a strong commitment to supporting student mental health and wellbeing — wanting to provide students across the whole area, with self-help strategies, but also ensuring greater availability of coaches and mentors willing to work directly with young people.

## **Cheltenham Science Festivals Fame Lab Academy**

The Cheltenham Science festival season has started with "Fame Lab Academy". This prestigious competition runs each year and aims to promote science communication in schools with year 9 students. Students have to write a three-minute presentation on a topic of their choosing and perform it with no notes, no PowerPoint and only a prop they can hold in their hands. Their talk needs to be full of amazing scientific facts, be communicated clearly and have plenty of charisma to capture the attention of the audience. With the help of STEM ambassador Emma Yhnell from Cardiff University, students competed in their classes to make it through to the School Final.

The 10 finalists performed their presentations in front of Mr Pauling and other senior staff and did an amazing job. The year 7 audience were treated to talks ranging from "Is the moon landing fake?" to "Chemicals found in face cream". After careful consideration the judges awarded William Huntley first place and a chance to perform his talk "How light travels" at the Gloucestershire final on 24th March. William will also attend a masterclass at the University of Gloucestershire to prepare for the final. All finalists will attend the Gloucestershire final at the Bacon Theatre, Dean Close School to support William.

The whole Science department wishes William the best of luck and congratulates all the finalists on their amazing achievements.


## **Sports News**

Well done to Ben in year 11 who took part in the Cotswold Marathon last weekend—walking overnight the full 30 mile gold route in 14 hours.














## Grease is the word!
