Holiday Free School Meal Voucher Scheme



We would like to make you aware of the holiday Free School Meal (FSM) voucher scheme that Gloucestershire County Council is currently offering to families in Gloucestershire.

Applications for holiday FSM vouchers for February 2024 Half-Term will be open from midday 16 January until midday on 30 January. Voucher emails will be sent from week commencing 5 February. Please check your junk/spam folders

up there. If vouchers have not been received by 7 February, please email <u>childrensfund@gloucestershire</u>. gov.uk.

This Winter holiday period, Gloucestershire County Council will provide families in receipt of Free School Meals, who sign up to this offer, with vouchers to assist with food costs during the school holidays. The vouchers are funded through grant funding we have received, and they are separate to that of term time free school meals.

The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who receive Pupil Premium (benefits-related) free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire. They are unable to consider college and sixth form students, nor children who receive infant free school meals (available to all children from reception to year 2) - they are not eligible for this scheme.

Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive a total of £15 per child.

Families who have signed up previously do not need to re-register for February 2024 holiday vouchers- they will already have been included. Families that have previously signed up will need to contact Glos CC with any changes to circumstances (e.g. if the number of children eligible increases or decreases). To ensure they reach all those who are eligible as they are encouraging parents that have not previously signed up, to sign up as soon as they can.

Please note we check eligibility for the scheme by cross-referencing with the term-time free school meal register, so please make sure parents are registered beforehand. They can register by visiting the apply for free school meals page.

Using vouchers – vouchers need to be used will only be awarded once the parent has registered for the scheme and cannot be backdated. Vouchers are valid for 6 months, although should be used in the holiday period in which they are awarded. If vouchers are not claimed and have expired, they cannot be re-issued. Vouchers not received should be queried via email to <u>childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk</u> by the end of the holiday period.




The Faraday Engineering Challenge



Keeping Safe on Expedition

Chosen Hill School DofE Award Participants Learn the

Basics of Outdoor First Aid

Chosen Hill School's DofE Award Scheme participants have been learning what to do in the event of an emergency whilst on their remotely supervised expeditions this summer.

On Saturday 13th January 2024 the Silver and Gold DofE Award partcipants took part in a 1-day training course organised and led by the School's Medical Officer, Mike Hemming and supported by Mr. I.Bird, DofE Manager and Gold Award Leader, and Mr. A.Differ, Silver Award Leader. The participants learnt about how to safely and effectively deal with a range of probable injuries that could occur whilst conducting their summer expeditions. As a result, not only do they have the skills and confidence to keep safe whilst on expedition, but the School and local community now have an additional 22 young people capable of saving a life.

Later on, in May, we will be running a second course, for the 52 Bronze Award participants, ahead of their 2day expedition in Term 6.

A massive thank you to the adult instructors for volunteering their time to organise and run this training day and to the participants for engaging in the training with enthusiasm - working hard to successfully learn these vital skills.

The DofE Award was re-introduced into Chosen Hill School in 2013. In that time over 450 students have participated in the scheme with us. Particpants currently volunteer for over 40 local organisations and international links continue with Thanthwe Primary School, Malawi, Africa, through ongoing efforts to raise the funds needed to complete the build of two additional classrooms.

Currently, students have the option to enrol on the Bronze Award in Year 9, the Silver Award in Year 10 and the Gold Award in Year 12.

Buckle Up!

The Law states that seat belts MUST be worn if they are fitted to a coach or bus. This will be relevant for School trips and private hire for events. We realise how difficult it is to get teenagers to do this but due to the recent coroners report into the Wirral Bus Incident there will be increased focus. We will be reminding operators, schools, parents and students with a campaign in the new year.

Bus Passes

Students must scan their passes at the beginning of all journeys. This prevents ineligible students from travelling and it also checks student use. If a student's pass does not scan in the morning, they may still be taken to school. The Student should go to reception by mid-morning break to have the pass visually checked for damage, (cracks and scratches). If the pass is damaged or lost, then the parent/ carer will need to purchase a replacement online. The School should email us by lunchtime to request an authorisation letter to allow afternoon travel.

Gloucestershire

Process for Bus Discipline

CCTV is a requirement on all Gloucestershire County Council contracted routes for schools transport use. We have rules and processes laid out in the code of conduct that all parent / carers must sign up to.

With Stagecoach Buses the process is different to our operated routes as they control the access to CCTV.

When an incident occurs on a Stagecoach route that involves a student we provide transport for, it may be reported to a member of school staff, the school must then contact us to report the incident. We will then ask Stagecoach to investigate the CCTV for evidence and agree with the school and stagecoach a suitable course of action to resolve the behaviour issues.

Because the Stagecoach routes are a public transport service we have no direct control over who is able to access these services, we only control the use of Council funded transport passes.


