
## Parking Reminder

Please be considerate when dropping off and collecting your children by car. We have had numerous issues with parents/carers parking on pavements causing pedestrians to walk into the road, risking an accident, as well as parking across driveways preventing our neighbours from leaving their properties.

The issue has been exacerbated since the Brookfield Road closure, with the volume of traffic increasing dramatically due to cars turning around to go back the way they came.

Mindful parking not only decreases the volume of traffic, ensuring the safety of the students, but also decreases the inconvenience that is often caused to our neighbours.

**Please do not park or turn in the areas in front of the school gates. There are signs in place as reminders, as well as yellow zig zags painted on the ground. Using the deltas as parking/turning areas causes congestion and risk of accidents, especially during busy periods.**



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## Helmet wearing for students riding bikes to school

Just a reminder for students that ride bikes to school about the importance of wearing a helmet; many students have been seen hanging their helmet on their handlebars or putting them loosely on their heads without securing it.

According to CYCLESUK, a major study of cycle helmet use around the world taken from more than 64,000 cyclists, has found cycle helmets reduce the risk of serious injury as follows:

- Head injury, reduced by 51%
- Serious head injury, reduced by 69%
- Face injury, reduced by 33%
- Fatal head injury by 65%

*The cycle helmet shown in the image was damaged in a road traffic accident, just imagine if the cyclist wasn't wearing a helmet! Wearing the helmet undoubtedly saved the cyclist from a serious, possibly fatal head injury.*

## Confiscated items

We have accumulated many confiscated items which we are holding at reception. Parents have been contacted to collect the items as students will not be permitted to do so. If you have been contacted, and have not collected these items yet, please could you make arrangements to do so as soon as possible. We will be disposing of the items during the summer holidays if they are not collected by the end of term.

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## Lost Property

Please remember to name all of your child's uniform and equipment so that it can be easily returned if it is misplaced.

We currently have a large amount of lost property which is not named, including water bottles. If your child has misplaced anything please, remind them to check with lost property. Any items not collected by the end of term will be disposed of during the summer holidays.

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## Hayfever

If your child suffers with hayfever please could you remind them to take their medication/sprays/eye drops in the morning before they leave for school. If there are any issues during the school day, then there are a couple of things they can do to help lessen the effects.

Use Vaseline just under the nose as this helps stop pollen/spores entering the nasal passage.



Bathe eyes with a cloth or toilet roll that has been soaked in cold water as this helps to remove any pollen/spores around the eye area.

Please remind your child, unless the symptoms are so bad that they are too ill to continue with the school day, not to go to First Aid for hayfever treatment as we are not permitted to dispense antihistamines and therefore do not store them.

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## Chosen Hill School Dress Code Policy 2022-2023

As many parents/ carers will be aware, a new law was passed in Parliament which required schools to follow new statutory guidance set out by the Department of Education concerning school uniform.

The school has now implemented a new dress code for the academic year 2022-23. The new dress code is moving towards being gender neutral with compulsory and optional uniform items.

The purpose of the new dress code is for our students to feel comfortable and able to fully participate in school life. The school understands that there is no constructive or sensible reason why the student population should wear different clothes. Research shows that gender stereotypes can restrict the access to learning and physical activity of some students.

Chosen Hill is an inclusive school that treats students as equals. This means the school actively challenges all gender stereotypes and fixed ideas about what students can do/achieve/enjoy/express. The school reflects society and has a LGBTQ+ community. It is important that students can wear clothes that make them comfortable. The main goal is for every child to feel a sense of security and belonging at school.

The school is also helping to keep the cost of uniform down, by reducing some of the branded items as compulsory uniform. This means that although many of our parents will use the school's uniform supplier, other high street options such as supermarkets are available.



## Year 9 Bronze DofE Training Weekend 21-22 May 2022

29 Students attended the training weekend. At the start of the day a full kit check took place, then teams were trained in using a map and compass and how to use pacing and timings to assist their navigation.

In the afternoon they tested their skills as they navigated around the local area between the school, Staverton and Down Hatherley.

On their return their tents were erected on the school field and evening meals were cooked on Trangias after being instructed on stove safety.

Before retiring to bed at 10pm, students had time to relax with many playing ball games.

Sunday morning was an early rise for some students who decided another ball game was in order. By 7:30 am all teams started to organise themselves in packing their personal equipment, taking down tents and preparing their breakfast. This was quite a slow process. Eventually, by 10am they were ready for their unaccompanied expedition around Witcombe Roman Villa, the church and the Cotswold Way, only being met at various check points. All teams had finished by 4pm and transported back to school to clean and hand in group equipment before departing for home at 5pm.

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## Bronze DofE qualifying expedition 11/12 June 2022

The Saturday started with a kit check, gathering and packing group equipment. Then meeting with their assessor to talk about their aims for the weekend.


Teams were then transported by the school minibuses to Birdlip to walk their routes to Bubbs Hill, Cowley, where they camped overnight. The weather was fine and mostly sunny but quite windy.



After a few navigation errors, the teams got into their stride travelling through the countryside meeting their assessors and helpers at various checkpoints.

By 5pm, all arrived at Bubbs Hill where tents were erected and meals cooked on their camping stoves. Students then enjoyed some free time by rolling and running down a grass slope watched anxiously by the leaders.

On the Sunday morning we woke at 7am to sunshine. Organising themselves to pack and make breakfast, they were ready for the return trek to Birdlip following opposite routes. With only a few navigation mishaps, all finished around 4pm; except one team who took an extra detour along the Cotswold Way to Cranham Sawmills. They were rescued by Mr Differ in the mini-bus. Once all had returned to school, tents were aired, cooking equipment cleaned, all other equipment handed in and, after a final chat with the assessors, students were free to ring parents to go home for a well-earned rest ready for school the following day.



Well done to the 25 students who gained their expedition section over this weekend. Thanks also to all the volunteer staff that helped with making both weekends successful.
