Young Carers

Did you know Chosen Hill School can provide extra support for Young Carers? We would like to offer advice, help and support to ensure that school is a positive place where all students can thrive.

As many as one in 12 students at Chosen Hill School could be a Young Carer, and many worry about their family member when they are away from them. Young Carers may be tired, find it difficult to concentrate and have limited time for friendships and activities after school. As a school we know how important their role is at home and that this might sometimes prevent them from taking part in extracurricular activities, seeing their friends, completing homework, etc.



We can ensure staff know about students caring role at home,. We can be supportive and flexible if they are struggling to get to school on time or if they need to be in contact with home during the school day. We can also provide advice and guidance on Young Carer issues, benefits, local support groups, as well as someone to talk to and much more.

Mrs Hannis (Pupil Premium Manager) and Mr Clark (Assistant Year Lead of Key Stage 4) will be running a Young Carer group every Thursday lunchtime in H4. We will have food, snacks, drinks, etc, and a chance to meet other Young Carers, discuss any issues or things students need help with both in school and at home. We hope this will be a chance for them to feel supported and have fun!

Behaviour on Buses and Outside of School

We have had some complaints from members of the public recently about some behaviour of our students outside of school and on the buses in particular. We will be meeting with the bus operators to develop a code of conduct and a strategy for those that are unable to behave appropriately in the coming weeks. A reminder that whilst students are travelling to and from school, and are wearing school uniform, our school behaviour policy applies.

Helmet wearing for students riding bikes to school

Just a reminder for students that ride bikes to school about the importance of wearing a helmet; many students have been seen hanging their helmet on their handlebars or putting them loosely on their heads without securing it.

According to CYCLESUK, a major study of cycle helmet use around the world, taken from more than 64,000 cyclists, has found cycle helmets reduce the risk of serious injury as follows:

Head injury, reduced by 51% Serious head injury, reduced by 69% Face injury, reduced by 33% Fatal head injury by 65%

The cycle helmet shown in the image was damaged in a road traffic accident, just imagine if the cyclist wasn't wearing a helmet! Wearing the helmet undoubtedly saved the cyclist from a serious, possibly fatal head injury.



The school will be following up shortly by sending out the Cycle to School policy.

Mental Health Talks - Cally Rhodes

We were excited to have Cally Rhodes in school on Tuesday 26th April, who performed her music and spoke to Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 students throughout the day. Cally is a Welsh singer/songwriter who writes catchy, melodic and honest dance-pop music. Her original music has been streamed over 20 million times online and her singles have appeared in Spotify Top 50 Charts all over the world. Cally was named 'Best Introducing Artist of the Year 2019' by BBC Introducing, as well as having her songs played on BBC's "Strictly Come Dancing".

In between song performances Cally discussed the importance of working hard at school, why education is so important, how it impacts life after school and the options students have after school as well as discussing her own personal stories and achievements. She has also had her own experiences and issues with mental health and body image. She shared this and openly discussed mental health, the causes of mental health problems (stress at school, relationships, what has happened during the pandemic, etc), who to ask for help and how to do it, and the importance of speaking up and discussing how to talk about emotions accurately and sensitively. She also raised issues surrounding social media, and the effect of this on a person's mental health and self-esteem.



It was a truly inspirational talk, and we hope that students will take lots of key messages from it, including the main ones about believing in yourself and your abilities and the importance of hard work. Gold DofE Practice Expedition 2022 Dartmoor Delight!

Five intrepid Gold DofE Award participants - Jude Carlile, Jamiee Clarke, Matthew Gore, Phoebe Hatton and Ryan Nash - undertook their practice Gold DofE Award expedition on Dartmoor from 19th to 22nd April 2022. They had to complete a 48 km route without outside assistance over the 4 days.

After the first day, which was used to do Dartmoor orientation and a final skills assessment, they were only remotely supervised by Mr. Bird and Mrs. Harpham. Consequently, they had to work hard on their micro-navigation skills, battling against quite a strong wind, to ensure they stayed on track and didn't get lost.

Starting on the Tuesday afternoon, immediately after the Easter bank holiday, the team climbed over Higher Tor, visited Neolithic settlements, an ancient stone circle and forded two rivers before reaching the location of their first wild camp on White Moor.





The next day, they journeyed on to Steeperton's Gorge via a circular route to the South-West, visiting Hangingstone Hill, Black Hill, Black Ridge and Okement Hill - some 16 kms with heavy packs and lots of bog hopping!!! Along this route no habitation could be seen at all, so it really gave the participants a sense of isolation and being at one with nature.

Having camped overnight, in the gorge, they cooked a hearty breakfast, before setting off again, Thursday morning, on an 12 km route; which saw them reach the highest point of the moor, Yes Tor (719 Meters above sea level), before heading down to set up camp and cook their evening meal at Henry's Ford.



On the way they stopped to explore the disused railway that was once used to provide moving targets for the Royal Army to practice aiming their artillery.



Heading out from Henry's Ford on Day 4, the teams disappeared into the mist/light rain as they headed uphill to the summit of Belstone Tor. From there, they headed down the Irishman's wall and up and over Higher Halstock Common before meeting the road, which they followed to the army camp and the finish.

Throughout, the participants showed great determination, coping with the difficult terrain, cutting their own latrines and purifying water. Pulling together as a team they helped and supported each other to surpass previously conceived limits. They were a credit to themselves and the school. With fortitude and laughter – and some doggy jokes - they persevered and successfully passed their practice expedition. A massive well done to them all. Thanks, also to their parents for supporting their DofE journey and Mrs. Harpham for supporting me with the supervision throughout this challenging practice expedition.

The team are currently preparing for their practice expedition presentation before starting the planning for their actual assessed expedition, which is scheduled for the second week in July. We wish them every success.
