3D A-Level is practical course in which you learn by doing, so you will be able to create imaginative personal work. You will find out about a whole range of media, techniques and processes. You will develop your creativity and independent thought, learn to express yourself visually and let your imagination flourish.

Three-dimensional design is a great companion to all other subjects as creativity, imagination and problem-solving skills can give you great ideas for your other subjects.

60% Personal Investigation and related study

- Practical coursework project responding to a theme by candidate/centre
- A related written study of continuous prose with minimum 1,000 words
- Internally assessed and externally moderated

40% Externally Set Task

- Question paper released in February (available from February of Year 13)
- One question selected from a range of starting points & stimuli
- Research & developmental studies leading to a 15 hour practical response in May of Year 13
- Internally assessed and externally moderated
