Safeguarding and Lockdown

You will be aware of the tragic incident that took place at Tewkesbury School earlier this week. Our thoughts are very much with those affected. We know the strength of their school community will help them to cope with what has happened.

From a Chosen Hill perspective, I would like to provide some reassurance about the importance and consideration invested in the safety of your child, both in and outside of school, when under our care. Thankfully significant events like those earlier in the week are incredibly rare – but we are mindful to not be complacent and to share some of the measures that are in place if required.

Safeguarding and the safety of your children is our priority. Like all schools, we have lockdown plans ready in case of emergency even though such events are unlikely to occur. A security lockdown procedure is a standard health and safety procedure, similar to a fire drill. It would be used when there is a threat to the safety of our students, staff and others in the school, and when it is safer for everyone to remain in school rather than evacuate. The aim is to keep people safe by confining them to a secure place of safety.

As part of our ongoing evaluation we are continuing to review our lockdown procedures, which we will share with students regularly to ensure that any response is effective and the rationale for the actions understood by all. When we do this it will be done carefully so as not to heighten anxiety, but more to remind and reassure.

Our plan includes;

- How students and staff are notified that we are in lockdown
- Immediate action to be taken by students and staff
- How we will make sure we can account for all students and staff
- How we will make sure all students are safe and secure

In the event of a school lockdown, we would notify parents via email, school gateway and Class Charts announcements. Our priority would be to keep everyone safe and avoid panic – for clarity students would be told not to use phones to communicate with others or post on social media. It is our intention to schedule a lockdown practice early in the new academic year – we will communicate this ahead of the event in September.

If you or your child have any concerns or questions, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF)

The Holiday Activity and Food Programme (HAF) is returning this summer for children and young people in reception to year 11, who are eligible for pupil premium free school meals.

The programme runs during the summer holidays. Online activity bookings for the HAF programme open at 12pm 5 July. Bookings usually go very fast after launch, so it is important to ensure you are informed of this before the date. Families can make sure they are HAF ready by registering on our Children's Activity Booking System (CABS).

Families who have signed up to the scheme or who are already registered will receive 2 weeks of vouchers for the summer holiday at £15 per child per week. For the remaining 4 weeks of this holiday period, the HAF programme provides a meal for children attending the activities they are booked onto.
