Effective learners systematically review their learning. Asking your child what they have learnt at school is a useful way to encourage them to re-cap their key learning for the day. Rather than ask your child 'What did you do today?' ask them 'Did you find anything you learnt surprising today'.

Late to Lessons Update

As mentioned in a previous parent bulletin, during term 4, the school has been focusing on students being responsible and arriving at every lesson on time. This means as with late to school, late punctuality to lessons is also being classified as a negative behaviour. The name of a student who is late, is being recorded on Class Charts as a negative behaviour.

The school has been piloting this for the first three weeks to see who is being late and why. From the week beginning 20th March if a student still chooses to arrive to a lesson late, there will be a consequence that is in line with the Late to School arrangements. This will be communicated to student during their LM time.

Schoolbeat have been set up by Gloucestershire Constabulary, and they are a team of police officers that visit Gloucester schools three times a year to deliver a program of classroom based lessons. The lessons are delivered to:

- Reduce the risk of young people becoming victims or offenders of crime and ASB
- To raise awareness of risks and threats to the safety of young people on and off line
- To empower students to make positive decisions and provide them with a problem solving 'tool box' for when life gets bumpy
- To support schools with safeguarding, reduce pupil exclusions and provide advice on day to day police related issues

Schoolbeat officers deliver information on the following topics:

Year 7 – Grooming, Drugs and Alcohol Year 8 – Sexting and exploitation Year 9 – Domestic abuse and county lines

As part of the sessions Schoolbeat also signpost to relevant agencies which can provide additional support and information. These include:

THANTHWE PRIMARY SCHOOL: CYCLONE FREDDIE DISASTER RELIEF APPEAL

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED NOW!



Since the summer of 2016, we have developed an international partnership with Thanthwe Primary School, Malawi, Africa. Since then, we have raised funds to support the building of two brand new classrooms because up until recently the school had just 4 run down classrooms in which to teach 649 students. We have also set up and maintained a penpal project between students.

Malawi is the poorest country in Africa and is one of the world's worst hit by HIV-Aids with more than one million children orphaned by the disease. The majority of

the population scrape out a living as subsistence farmers and food security is precarious due to the extreme climate.

Two Days ago Cyclone Freddie ripped through the village of Thanthwe destroying the homes of over 100 families; many have been injured or even killed.

The school has converted its classrooms into makeshift shelters for the families made homeless by the storm.

The staff of Thanthwe School have reached out to us to request warm bedding, clothing, and necessities like toiletries.





If you have any clean, useable items or unwanted toiletries that you could kindly donate to the appeal, it would be of huge assistance to the homeless families in Thanthwe village. Simply drop them into reception early next week.
