Chosen Hill School Dress Code

Parents and carers are asked to ensure that their child follows the dress code at all times. Whilst wearing Chosen Hill School uniform, students are representing the school in the local community. Any behaviour out of school whilst wearing our uniform, which falls short of our expectations and which brings the school's reputation into disrepute may result in disciplinary action.

Uniform is an important area, which helps to set the standards. The school has a clear dress code, but this does not always ensure that this is worn correctly. Parents and carers can help the school by checking that your child leaves home wearing the uniform correctly. This includes jewellery.

- A small, plain, single stud earring may be worn in each lobe which must be removed for Physical Education lessons. Ear bars and 'stretchers' are not allowed.
- Moderate, natural looking make-up only.
- No false nails or eyelashes. Nail varnish should be natural looking only.
- Hairstyles should be tidy and inconspicuous long hair should be tied back during PE or practical lessons.
- No extreme styles or unnatural hair colours are allowed.

School Uniform: Optional Summer Uniform

As we prepare to enter our Summer terms, and hope for some warm, dry summer weather, we would like to remind you that students have the option of wearing a white short-sleeved polo shirt with the school logo (available from Monkhouse Schoolwear Specialists who have a store in Cheltenham and Gloucester. The polo shirt replaces the formal shirt and tie. Another optional uniform item, which replaces the skirt/trousers is black formal tailored school shorts - remember any other shorts are not school uniform.

School Uniform: Reminder

Students need to have their shirts tucked in at all times. Blazers are to be worn on entering and leaving the lesson and moving around the school site.

Please remind your child to ensure that they have their 'Top 10' with them at school each day. Please also remind them they can use students services before school to ensure they are full equipped before the school day starts.

Dartmoor Determination

Gold DofE Practice Expedition – Easter 2023

Four resilient and determined participants undertook their Practice Gold DofE Expedition on Dartmoor during the second week of the Easter holidays. They planned to complete a 48 km route in generally very poor weather conditions. Consequently, the team had to work hard on their micro-navigation skills, battling against the wind, rain and hail, as they followed their route through the mist.

Starting on Tuesday, the teams climbed over Oke Tor, fording two rivers before reaching the location of their first wild camp on White Moor.

Purifying water from streams and cooking a hot revitalising meal, the team settled down to an uncomfortable night as the storm continued to range around them.





The next day, they journeyed on to Hangingstone Hill, visiting a Neolithic stone circle before weather conditions deteriorated even further and forced a retreat off the moor via Okement Hill and East Mill Tor.

Not perturbed by the forced withdraw from the Moor, the team returned to Chosen Hill School, where they overnighted, and the next day utilised the ongoing 'DofE with a Difference' expedition variations - put in place during the Covid Pandemic - to complete the final day of their practice expedition, in non-familiar local country, in the Cotswolds.





Throughout, the participants showed great determination, coping with horrendous weather conditions, the difficult terrain and steep gradients. Pulling together as a team, they helped and supported each other to surpass previously conceived limits.

They were a credit to themselves and the school and successfully passed their practice expedition. A massive well done!

They will now start the detailed planning for their assessed expedition in July.
