Dear Parent/Carer

Thank you for your patience as we try and work out the best option for the next two National Education Union (NEU) teachers' strike days on Wednesday 5th and Friday 7th July.

As with previous industrial action we have been looking at the feasibility of accommodating additional year groups. Our key consideration in only offering a partial opening of the school is based on the extent to which safe levels of supervision can be maintained throughout the school day. Given the potential number of staff on strike and that they are not obliged to share their intention to strike, I am only able to guarantee the safe supervision of two year groups.

To this end, school will be open for the following groups of students only over these two days:

- Wednesday 5th July Year 12, Year 10 and targeted vulnerable students
- Friday 7th July Year 12, Year 9 and targeted vulnerable students

Normal timetabled lessons will be taught to the students in school on these days by staff present in school.

Students should arrive at school at the normal time (08:25 roll call) in full school uniform. Normal bus routes will be running and the canteen will be open (though with a reduced range). Whilst confirmation of the full list of teachers in school will not be known until the morning of the strike days, I am confident that we are able to safely open the school to the year groups identified above.

I am sorry we are not able to extend this provision to all year groups but have prioritised the students studying examination courses in this instance.

The students that are not in school will be set work by (non-striking) staff on ClassCharts. As with previous strike day provision, there will also be some centrally set resources (linked to the relevant and current curriculum topics) on our website under the Remote Learning pages.



Duke of Edinburgh Awards - Adult Volunteer Helpers Needed

Bronze Award Helpers:

Due to growing demand and the retirement of 3 key adult volunteers, we now are in urgent need of help from colleagues to ensure we are able to continue to offer the DofE Award here at Chosen Hill School.

There is no need to have formal outdoor education qualifications, but we are willing to fully fund the training and assessment for the Countryside and Coastal Leader (with camping endorsement) and an Outdoor First Aid Certificate, for those adult volunteers that would like to gain a nationally recognised outdoor education qualification.

Gold Award Helpers:

This academic year we are looking to expand the number of Sixth Form participants in Gold DofE Award. However, currently we only have one SWMML, I. Bird, who is available and willing to lead training and supervise the expeditions. This limits numbers to a maximum of just 10 students.

Furthermore, you would need to enrol into the Southwest Mountain and Moorland Leaders scheme or equivalent and complete the training and assessment for a Summer Moorland/Mountain Leader and an Outdoor First Aid Certificate. These qualifications will be fully funded too.

Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award

26 Students completed their Bronze Expedition Section this year.

On 13th May they took part in the first aid training necessary for when they are on their assessed expedition to ensure they are prepared in an emergency.

The following weekend the participants worked in their teams. On the Friday evening they pitched their tents and were instructed how to use the camping stoves (trangias) to prepare their evening meal. This was followed by rounders and general games on the school field before retiring for the night. The following morning at 7am the group rose cooked their breakfast, took down their tents and packed their full kit ready for the days hike in the local area to demonstrate their navigation skills learnt in the classroom sessions. Each of the four teams were accompanied by a DofE volunteer to help them accomplish the routes. Leaving from school to, home farm, the airport Staverton Church, Down Hatherley



Church, Brickhampton golf course and returning to school using the footpaths and Bridal ways.

The assessed Expedition on 17th-18th June commenced at Birdlip near the junior school. Here participants met their assessors and collected their group equipment. Two teams set off at 9:30 followed by the other Two at 10am. Following clockways or anti-clockways around the routes to Gloucestershire's Girlguiding site at Bubbs Hill. During the weekend groups visited Barrow Wake, Coberley Church, Cowley Church, Elkstone Church, Brimpfield Church, Hazel Hanger Woods and back to Birdlip. Teams were on their own being remotely supervised and only meeting the volunteers at points along their routes.



Day 1 all teams had little navigational errors, with one team who seemed to like Coberley Church and returned there an hour later. However, they all eventually found their way to the campsite a little tired; since although the weather was overcast it was very muggy. At least the forecasted rain and thunderstorms were avoided. After a rest and their cooked food, they all enjoyed time playing games and generally amusing themselves before bed.

Day 2 the groups did the opposite route back to Birdlip with improved navigation. Besides the navigation each group had to choose a project to do during their journey. These were discussed with their assessor at the end of the expedition. Most groups

took photographs of their route and objects of interest like the buildings and the wild flowers A couple of the teams want to collage their photos or present a blog at a later date.

Well done to all of them! I hope they will to continue their DofE journey and go on to do the Silver or Gold award.

I would like to thank my expedition volunteers, Tom Care, Colin Johnston, Beth Pert, Ron Harpham who supervised along the routes and Andy Differ and Gilly Traverse who assessed.








Photography at Chosen Hill School
