Chosen Hill School Dress Code

Parents and carers are asked to ensure that their child follows the dress code at all times. Whilst wearing Chosen Hill School uniform, students are representing the school in the local community. Any behaviour out of school whilst wearing our uniform, which falls short of our expectations and which brings the school's reputation into disrepute may result in disciplinary action.

Uniform is an important area, which helps to set the standards. The school has a clear dress code, but this does not always ensure that this is worn correctly. Parents and carers can help the school by checking that your child leaves home wearing the uniform correctly. This includes jewellery.

- A small, plain, single stud earring may be worn in each lobe which must be removed for Physical Education lessons. Ear bars and 'stretchers' are not allowed.
- Moderate, natural looking make-up only.
- No false nails or eyelashes. Nail varnish should be natural looking only.
- Hairstyles should be tidy and inconspicuous long hair should be tied back during PE or practical lessons.
- No extreme styles or unnatural hair colours are allowed.

School Uniform: Optional Summer Uniform

As we prepare to enter our Summer terms, and hope for some warm, dry summer weather, we would like to remind you that students have the option of wearing a white short-sleeved polo shirt with the school logo (available from Monkhouse Schoolwear Specialists who have a store in Cheltenham and Gloucester). The polo shirt replaces the formal shirt and tie. Another optional uniform item, which replaces the skirt/trousers is black formal tailored school shorts - remember any other shorts are not school uniform.

Period products should be made available to those who need them in education as they're a necessity, not a luxury.

The Department for Education's (DfE) Period Product scheme to provide free period products to young people who need them in schools and colleges across England is now available.

This scheme will enable all learners to participate fully in education by making period products available as and when they are needed. With a product offering that suits everyone, there's a choice of pads and tampons, including environmentally friendly products.

Students can access these products by dropping into the Careers Office at lunchtimes on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday each week. The area will be supervised by a female member of staff but they will not have to ask, they can just help themselves to whatever they need.

Intrepid Gold DofE Award participants from Chosen Hill School braved the windy and wet conditions of the Brecon Beacons National Park to put their expedition skills to the test during their Introduction to Wild Country Training Weekend, 18th -19th March 2023.

All demonstrated good levels of fitness, competence at navigation through wild country and campcraft. Please join us in congratulating them as they have now completed the formal training element of their Gold Award Assessed Expedition, scheduled for July 2023.

However, they do have one more challenge to complete ahead of July 2023. The team must be able to demonstrate how well they have mastered the expedition skills that they have been taught. Hence, they are now busy planning a remotely supervised 4-day practice expedition, to take place on Dartmoor, 11th – 15th April 2023. Over those 4 days they must effectively use their expedition and teamwork skills to safely conduct a completely self-sufficient walking journey of c. 70Kms. Afterwards, they must also present a practice project using evidence collected whilst journeying, and be able to accurately reflect on their individual performance and experience.




