#### Task 1

The Care Certificate is an agreed set of standards that define the knowledge, skills & behaviour expected of specific job roles in the health & social care sectors.

It's made up of 15 minimum standards.

You'll be expected to complete the Care Certificate if you're:

new to the care sector

employed as an adult social care worker

providing direct care in a range of settings such as a residential or nursing home, a hospice or are a home care or community worker.

You can also complete the Care Certificate if you are in a non-care working role eg a cook or part of a maintenance team.

You'll work towards achievement of the Care Certificate as part of your induction. To achieve the Care Certificate you'll be assessed on what you know and what you do to show that you understand & can carry out your role.

It normally takes around 12 weeks to fully complete the Care Certificate.

Each Care Certificate standard must be completed & assessed before you can work un-supervised.

You can use the learning from the Care Certificate towards some existing sector qualifications & apprenticeships.

Your employer or manager will sign off and confirm the completion of the Care Certificate with you.
