Chosen Hill School Leadership Arrangements

The Senior Leadership Team includes the Headteacher, two Deputy Headteachers, four Assistant Headteachers and the Business Manager.

The structure comprises of Heads of Faculties for: English, Maths, Science, BUSIT (Business and ICT), DART, Physical Education, Modern Foreign Languages, Performance Arts and Humanities.

A faculty further comprises of Assistant Faculty Leads and Subject Leads.

In conjunction with faculties there are whole school coordinator roles with specific cross school briefs

DART (Design Technology and Art) Faculty

The DART Faculty consists of a team of 10 staff with varying levels of experience and responsibility, some full and some part time teaching, and two technicians. The DART Faculty includes teachers of Art & Design, Photography, DT (Food Technology, Textiles, 3D).

Staff are based within their own teaching room for the majority of the time, however with current Covid arrangements, students will be taught in 'year bubbles' and teaching staff will move around the school site accordingly. Alternative planning for specialist teaching of practical lessons is also in place.

In DART the Foundation phase is organised into two disciplines – Art and Design Technology – across Years 7 and 8. DT encompasses the discrete areas of Food, Textiles and 3D Design. Art lessons are multi-disciplinary, incorporating drawing, photography, painting, sculpture and printmaking across the two years.

The aim of both Art and DT is to equip our students with a portfolio of skills that are not only an essential foundation for progression through the GCSE pathways on offer in DART, but make a significant contribution to a student's creative development.

Both courses offer term-length projects with different foci, designed to challenge and offer new experiences to students from all starting points.

At GCSE level, the DART faculty offer expands to include Photography, 3D Design, Fine Art, Food and Textiles. The food offer is currently the WJEC L2 in Hospitality & Catering but GCSE Food Technology has been offered historically.

Photography, Fine Art, Textiles and 3D Design all fall under the auspice of AQA Art & Design courses. Photography can be combined with any of the other courses.

The aim of these courses is to inspire and challenge our students to become specialists in their field; to broaden and deepen their knowledge, skills and confidence over the course of the KS3 curriculum.

Pastoral System

Chosen Hill School has a long tradition of strong pastoral care and support based on mutual respect and high expectations. We recognise that the modern world is an increasingly challenging place for young people with the rise of social media and the pressures of academic assessment. We have a well-resourced and focussed student services provision alongside our pastoral leaders to provide strong support and guidance for students both for the day to day needs and for more specific support. The quality of this provision is recognised by the school's award as a Mental Health Champion and Healthy School's status.

Each student is part of a Learning Mentor Group with one key adult as their first port of call each day in the form of their Learning Mentor. The Learning Mentor is the first person to whom a student will turn for help or advice and the first point of contact at the school for parents. Each Learning Mentor group is attached to one of our four Houses – Carne, Whittle, Masefield and Scott.

Each year group follows a richly resourced Learning Mentor programme delivered by the Learning Mentor which focuses on Literacy, Numeracy and personal, cultural and social development in the KS3 and study skills, exam skills, personal and leadership development and futures guidance in the KS4.

Each year group is overseen by a Year Lead – Progress Coordinator who oversees the progress and development of each child in the cohort, focusing on their academic and personal progress and development and ensuring each student receives the support and guidance they need to remove any barriers to learning.

Each curriculum phase receives strategic oversight from a Senior Progress Coordinator.

Learning Mentor Role

- To be a Learning Mentor to an assigned group of students in line with contracted hours.
- To promote the general progress and well-being of individual students and of the Learning Mentor Group as a whole.
- To liaise with Year Leads to ensure the implementation of the school's Pastoral System.
- To register students, accompany them to assemblies, encourage their full attendance at all lessons and their participation in other aspects of school life.
- To evaluate and monitor the progress of students and keep up-to-date student records as may be required.
- To contribute to the preparation of Action Plans and progress files and other reports.

•	To alert the appropriate staff to problems experienced by students and to make
	recommendations as to how these may be resolved.
•	To communicate as appropriate, with the parents of students and with persons or bodies outside
	the school concerned with the welfare of individual students, after consultation with the
	appropriate staff
•	To contribute to the Personal Development Curriculum according to school policy
•	To apply the Behaviour management systems so that effective learning can take place.
