#### **Initial Expedition Skills and Fitness Assessment**

This year's teams of intrepid Gold DofE Award participants from Chosen Hill School completed a circular walk of the Miserden area of the Cotswolds to demonstrate their competence at expedition skills during their Initial Expedition Skills and Fitness

Assessment Walk on Sunday 1st March 2025

Throughout the day, participants had to carry a fully loaded expedition pack, work as a team to accurately navigate a course through the Cotswolds, safely cook a meal on the Trangia camping stove and handle first aid casualty scenarios.

They approached the assessment with good humour and all of them demonstrated a good level of fitness, competence at navigation, stove safety and casualty management. A few things were pick up for further development during the day but on the whole they are on progress for this stage of the course.

Please join us in congratulating them as they have successfully passed this important milestone in their Gold Award expedition training and move on towards their Cycle and Camping Skills Training Weekend, scheduled for 28-29th March 2025.

#### **Thantwe Primary School Appeal**

We have received notification form Thanthwe Primary School, Malawi, Africa, that the desks – purchased with the £1,300 raised by the December non-uniform day and the 'Tape Mr. Bird to the Wall' charity event – how arrived and the children at the school are extremely excited about being able to work at them during lessons.

The village elders, the headteacher and staff at Thanthwe Primary School have asked us to pass on their sincerest gratitude to all who helped fundraise. Your efforts will have a positive impact on the learning experiences at the school; one which, until our involvement, had only 2 classrooms to teach 649 pupils. With our collective efforts, we have provided them with 2 additional classrooms each with desks, chairs and blackboards. The Malawian Government, have also now responded and helped build a fifth classroom.

The project now moves on to developing pen-pals and fundraising for improved sanitation, textbooks and equipment.

This will be the last fundraising project of the existing Sixth Form Ambassador Team; so, as we continue to nurture and develop a range of international collaborations, with the aim of developing a truly international dimension to learning here at Chosen Hill School, I'm sure you will join us in congratulating the outgoing team for their achievement and stand ready to support the new team with their future projects.

This exhibition presents the work of Fine Art and Photography students exploring the theme of GL50: OUR SURROUNDINGS REIMAGINED.

The students aim to reinterpret, transform or challenge preceptions of Cheltenham's urban, natural and cultural landscapes providing fresh perspectives on the familiar.



#### ABOUT THE PROJECT

Students were challenged to investigate the theme through their chosen mediums of painting, drawing, mixed media and photography. Asked to reimagine Cheltenham's surroundings with a focus on its landscape, landmarks or daily life and think about what makes Cheltenham unique, it's history, atmosphere or hidden narratives?

Their journeys will culminate in finished pieces for this exhibition supported by sketchbooks/portfolios and artwork statements for a fully rounded involvement of the artists' experience exhibiting.
