It was an intense but fair inspection which higlighted the many strengths and improving areas of the school as well as some areas for further development. Although we are pleased with the outcome I am not able to comment further until the report is published in the new year – at which point I will be able to share more of the findings and the judgements.

As we head into December we are looking forward to an exciting and industrious last three weeks of term. On Friday 28th November 2024 we were delighted to welcome Dr. Robert Whitehouse, Gloucestershire University Business School, into our A-Level Business class to help them prepare their new innovative business idea presentations for the upcoming Grand Final of the Gloucestershire Business School Challenge, which will take place on Wednesday 11th December 2024 at the university' 'state-of-the-art Business School at their Oxstalls Campus.

The teams ran through their presentations and Dr. Whitehouse provided constructive feedback on both content and technique, which the teams have taken on board to improve their work ahead of next Wednesday's final.

It was lovely to work in partnership with the university and we are currently looking at ways to increase the number of learning activities that our two organisations can collaborate on. Thanks to Dr. Whitehouse for giving his time and excellent contribution to the learning of our A-Level Business students, and to our students for going the extra mile to develop their business ideas and for their engagement during the session.

They are now strong contenders and we wish them the very best for the upcoming final.

DofE Highlights

Bronze DofE Students have now started their expedition skills training in earnest with Mr. Bird and the support of Jacob Wiggins, Roman Wardle and Hollie Cummins – 3 Gold DofE participants who are kindly sharing their skills and expertise to assist Mr. Bird whilst he covers the role, pending the appointment of New Bronze Award Leader. Most of the participants are now actively pursuing their sectional activities outside of school, with just one or two still working with Mr. Bird to set up any remaining programme plans.

Silver DofE has got off to a great start this term at Chosen hill. In their weekly sessions students have been learning to identify map symbols, taking 6 figure grid references and how to use a compass. We have spent time out on the field using compasses to see how precise we can be when walking a course and will soon be taking part in a blindfold challenge to help improve teamwork as well as use of a compass when visibility is low. In the classroom students have begun planning their routes for the first day of their silver expedition focusing on the 6D's of route planning. Students are also beginning to think about suitable projects based on the environment in which they will be in. Future sessions in the run up to Christmas will include food, always important, as well as more route planning.

The Gold DofE participants have decided to do a cycle expedition this year and Ms Jo. Clarke, as a qualified Mountain Bike Trial Leader, has kindly agreed to help the teams train and to assist Mr. Bird in supervising their expeditions during the Spring and Summer terms. We are looking forward to seeing how this works and the participants are working hard to refresh and enhance their expedition skills, ready for wild country next year.

Thank you, to all the parents/carers for their continued encouragement and support of our amazing participants as they continue their DofE journey. May we also ask you to check the most recent DofE Kit list (found here) and to ensure all items of personal expedition kit, and clothing are obtained – it is a great time to add needed kit to Christmas present lists and get the extended family and friends to help with the costs.
