Gold and Silver DofE First Aid Training Day

The first aid training day was packed with teamwork, practice, and invaluable life-saving skills. Running from 9:00 to 3:15 in the upper school hall, it was a full-on experience that left a lasting impression. We got to learn how to do CPR on dummies which we had to pump the chest 240 times in 2 minutes, can definitely say it was painful but interesting. We got to learn about the primary survey which included how to deal with a life-threatening injury like putting them into a recovery position if they are not responsive. What to do when someone has got a sunburn which is painful so I'm sure I'll be wearing my suncream. How to deal with blisters which you do not burst nor touch them as they can be painful. What a first aid kit includes and what it is not included (we definitely don't need butter in a first aid kit).

The skills we can definably say we attained from this could be how to do CPR properly, how to stay calm, recognizing what the injury could be like whether it's a concussion or what a stab wound it is and how to dress an injury.

It was fun and entertaining, and we got hands-on tasks and a chance to speak about hypothermia like what it is and the reasons for it. A wonderful experience and would feel great knowing how these skills could genuinely save a person's life. A huge thanks to all the staff and the trainee who supported us and made it into an impactful experience. As a student, it was inspiring to see how much thought and effort went into that day. Not only did we learn skills but got treated to delicious cake and cookies! Thank you again for making this experience memorable.



International Dimensions Update

This week a team of Year 10 GCSE Business students from Chosen Hill School came into school early to meet, for a second time, with their peers in India, via Zoom.



These 6 students have been participating in a voluntary, businessrelated international dimensions project, called SAIONEER. In collaboration with students from SAI International School, India.

The project requires students to set up and manage a small startup business, conduct market research, design market-orientated products and then sell them internationally with each school acting as in-country distribution agents for the other. Profits are then used to support ongoing charities such as SAI International's 100 Libraries Project in India and Chosen Hill's Classroom Building Project in Thanthwe, Malawi, Africa.

The purpose of this week's virtual conference was to enable Chosen Hill's team to ask a wide range of primary market research questions using SAI International students are their respondents, whilst also giving a progress report our efforts to sell SAI's products in the UK.

Our team left with some excellent information about what types of products Indian customers want, when and where to market them and what prices to charge.

Additionally, Mr, Webb and Mr, Bird met with Ms. Suchismita Chowdhury, Head-Global Dimensions, SAI International Residential School, to launch a brand-new music and dance project that we hope will see students from SAI International, Chosen Hill and our primary feeder schools participant in the Gym and Dance Show in November, making it a truly international event.

Famelab School Final

Famelab is a competition run by Cheltenham Science Festivals and involves secondary schools throughout Gloucestershire.

Pupils in year 9 learn how to research, prepare and deliver a three minute speech based on a STEM topic of their choice. At Chosen hill all year 9 pupils were involved in this competition. They were taught during science lessons how to research, how to include scientific content in their speech at a level their audience will understand what they are saying and how to deliver their talk clearly with a little bit of charisma to help captivate their audience. All pupils performed their speeches in class and each class voted for a finalist. 12 finalists were chosen who went through to today's school final.

The school final was hosted in the main hall with three classes of year 8 students in the audience. 3 judges listened to the fascinating speeches and asked questions of our finalists. From the study of chocolate to the science behind dreams, the duality of arsenics use and even the physics of how to throw the perfect dart, we were treated to some captivating speeches.

Our two runners up were Poppy Davis asking 'what would happen if the Minions managed to steal the moon?' and Tom Cox who gave us the science behind nuclear war - and all they ways that it would kill us!



Our winner was Oliver Brodie who impressed all three judges not only with his entertaining speech about super soldiers but with his level of confidence answering their questions about his talk and his answer that if he could be enhanced in the manner of a super solider he would use his powers to help those who needed it.

Oliver will now go forward to compete at the Roses theatre in Tewkesbury against 25 other school and the other 11 class winners will join the audience to cheer him on.
